CONNECTIONS

By Rail

Jalandhar City Railway Station is well-connected to other parts of the country, Jalandhar City is a major stop between the Amritsar-Delhi rail link which is serviced by Shatabdi Express, Intercity Express, and others. Direct train service is available for other major cities like Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai, Patna, Guwahati, Varanasi, Jaipur, Jhansi, Gwalior, Bhopal and Jammu Tawi.

By Air

The nearest airport is Adampur Airport, northwest of Jalandhar which currently handles only scheduled operation on maiden flights of private carrier Spicejet to Delhi, Mumbai and Jaipur. The nearest fully-fledged International Airport is Sri Guru Ram Dass Jee International Airport in Amritsar. It is second busiest airport in North India, and is connected to other parts of the country by regular flights. Several airlines operate flights from abroad, including London Stansted, Birmingham, Dubai, Singapore, Kuala Lumpur and Doha.

By Road

There is one of the largest networks of bus services of Punjab at Shaheed-e-Azam Sardar Bhagat Singh ISBT (Jalandhar), Himachal Pradesh, Delhi, Haryana, Chandigarh, Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Uttarakhand, Rajasthan State Roadways, apart from private operators.

FIRE SAFETY

When you arrive at the hotel

Locate the nearest EXIT from your room. Please find out how to shut off room cooling, Get a good mental picture of your room and the corridors outside. Refer to the Fire Exit Plan behind the room's main door.

To avoid fire please

- Do not smoke in room
- Do not throw smouldering material in the waste basket
- Disconnect all electrical appliances after use

Our staff is experienced to handle fire incidents and frequent patrols are made to all parts of the premises.

If you discover or suspect a fire, dial 9 for operator

If it is a minor fire, remove any combustible items that are close to the fire. If it is a major fire, please leave the area after sounding an alarm. Switch off the cooling in your room. Lock the door and take the key with you. Leave the floor using the nearest fire EXIT.

Do not use the Elevator

If there is smoke in the corridor, avoid the elevator and head for the nearest Fire Exit. If EXIT seems unsafe, return to the room and shut the door quickly and stay there until help arrives.

If you are forced to stay in your room

Call the Operator (Dial 9) and give the location. Switch off the cooling in your room to prevent smoke being forced into room. Place the mattress up against the door. Use wet towels, sheet and other materials to stuff all door cracks in order to prevent smoke entering the room.

PLACES TO VISIT

Devi Talab Mandir

Devi Talab Mandir is a 200-year-old Hindu temple located in Jalandhar, Punjab. It is in the heart of the city, which attracts thousands of people from all over the world. The main goddess is Durga, and it is one of the 51 Shakti Peethas in India. In recent times, the temple was renovated, and few changes have been made to the original structure.

Jung-E Azadi Memorial

Jang-e-Azadi is located at Kartarpur on the Amritsar-Jalandhar highway. It is a recently developed museum and is one of the mega projects in the state which is spread over 25 acres of land. It is a memorial for all the Punjabis who sacrificed their lives during the Indian Independence. It also gives a detailed picture of the culture of Punjabi's and India.

Wonderland Water Park

Wonderland is an amusement and water park located in the city. It is located in Nakadar Road which comes after Wadala Chowk and is 6 km away from Jalandhar Bus Station. The park functions as a conjuncture between rides, waterpark, dining hall, entertainment and shopping centre. It is spread over an area on 11 acres and entuses its visitors with its wave pool and aqua dance floor which plays Punjabi pop songs. The shopping centre is a hub for souvenirs for adults and a box of amusing toys for children.

Pushpa Gujral Science City

Science City Kapurthala, otherwise known as Pushpa Gujral Science City is a haven for science enthusiasts established by the Government of Punjab. At a distance of 15 km from Jalandhar, it is spread across an area of 72 acres. Its motto is to help people, especially younger children, develop an interest in the working of the physical world around them.

ABOUT THE DESTINATION

Jalandhar is the third most-populous city in the Indian state of Punjab and the largest city in Doaba Region. Jalandhar lies alongside the Grand Trunk Road and is a well-connected rail and road junction. Jalandhar is 146 km^[5] northwest of Chandigarh, the state capital of Punjab and Haryana and 83.5 km (51.2 mi) South-East of Amritsar.

The city is named after Jalandhar, a demon king, who is named in the Puranas and Mahabharata. The city was founded by Devasya Verma as mentioned in Vedas. The whole of Punjab and the area of present Jalandhar District was part of the Indus Valley Civilization.

Jalandhar was conquered by the Ghaznavids during the reign of Ibrahim of Ghazni between 1058 and 1089. The 18th century saw upheaval in Jalandhar amidst an anarchy caused by the disintegration of the Mughals and power struggles involving Persians, Afghans and Sikhs. In 1811 Maharaja Ranjit Singh incorporated it within the Sikh Empire.

In 1849, following the annexation of the Punjab by the East India Company, the city of Jalandhar, written in English as Jullundur by Company officials, became the headquarters of the Division and District of the same name. In 1858 Company rule in India ended and the city became part of the British Raj. In the mid to late 19th century, the Punjab administration regarded Jullundur as too densely populated and farmed to capacity.

In 1947, post partition it was made the administrative headquarter of Punjab but lost too soon when the administrative offices were shifted first to Shimla and finally to Chandigarh.

The city is popular destination with domestic and international travellers. It is famous for leather market and is a prominent sports and light engineering manufacturing goods hub of Asia.
